Background and Overview

The Maternal Mortality Review Committee (MMRC) is a multi-disciplinary committee focused on reviewing causes of maternal death in Colorado. The committee and associated efforts are housed within the Maternal Wellness Program at the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment.

Maternal mortality includes deaths occurring during pregnancy up through one year post delivery. Information is gathered from death certificates, medical records, autopsy reports, and other pertinent sources of information. Records are abstracted by a trained abstractor and de-identified case summaries are reviewed by the MMRC.

The MMRC currently operates on a three year delay. So, in 2014 the MMRC will be reviewing deaths that occurred in 2011.

This review process is intended to be educational and prevention-oriented in nature. The goals of the committee's reviews and associated maternal mortality work are to:

- 1. Identify trends and risk factors for pregnancy-related death in Colorado
- 2. Identify preventable risk factors
- 3. Develop strategies for prevention or intervention

The review is being conducted pursuant to C.R.S.25-1.5-102(II), C.R.S. 25-1-122(2) and Board of Health rules and regulations pertaining to the reporting of selected causes of morbidity and mortality in Colorado (6 CCR-1009-8). The Department of Public Health and Environment may have access, without patient consent, to medical records of fatalities that occur in association with pregnancy or for up to one year postpartum for which an autopsy was not performed or the Department determines was insufficient to fully determine the risk factors for the death.

The MMRC currently meets bimonthly from 7:30-9 am at CDPHE. Meeting dates for 2014 include: January 29 March 26 May 28 July 30 September 24 November 19 Most MMRC members will be expected to attend all meetings. However, certain expertise will only be needed for a handful of cases and those members will be notified of the meeting dates they will be expected to attend.

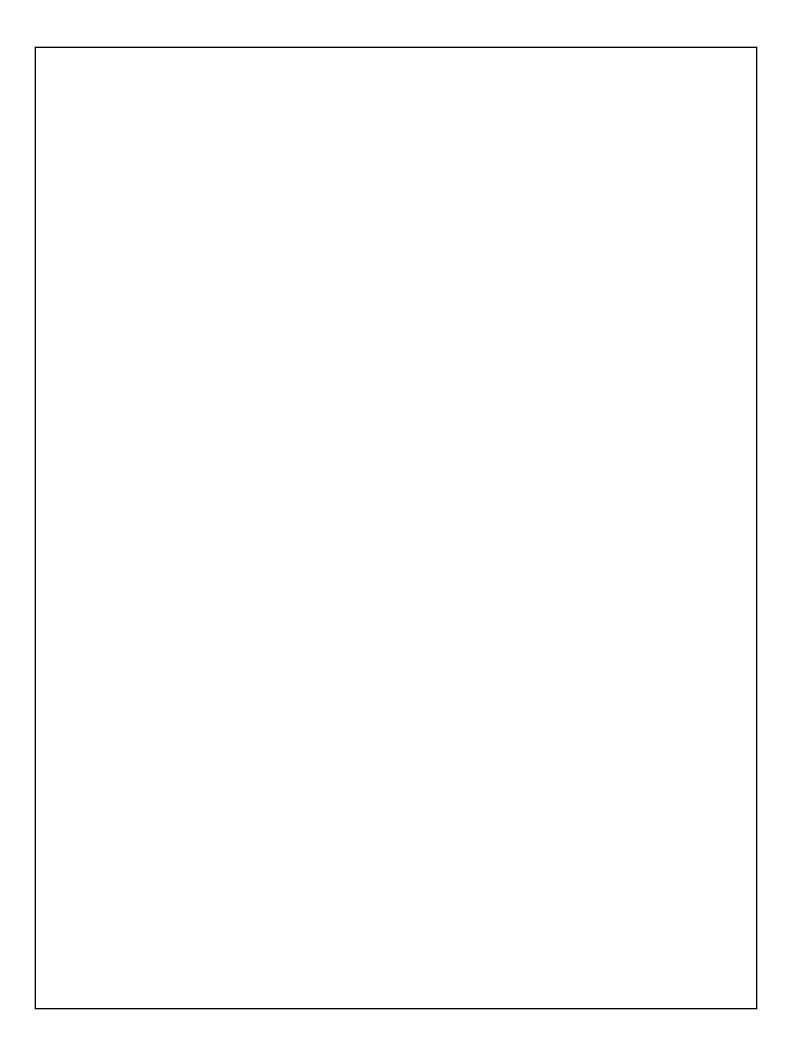
